Adverse Childhood Event (ACE) Study

Description: This training reviews the concepts and results of the Adverse Childhood Events (ACE) Study, a decades-long landmark study showing the relationship between traumatic childhood experiences with adult health and social problems.

When It Comes to Flu, You Call the Shots

You have the best interest of your patients at heart, and you have their trust. Your recommendation is the most effective way to ensure they get their flu shot.

When talking to your patients:

Make a strong recommendation to your patients to get their flu shot. Research shows that patients are more likely to get a flu shot if their doctor recommends they do so.

You can use the **SHARE** method to provide information:

Share reasons to get the flu shot based on their age or other risk factors
Highlight positive experiences with the flu shot to reinforce benefits
Address concerns about the vaccine, including effectiveness, side effects, safety and misconceptions

Remind patients that the flu shot not only protects them but also everyone around them

Explain that getting the flu can mean taking sick days from work or missing fun with family and friends
